4-C is part of a network of non-profit Wisconsin Child Care Resource and Referral agencies providing advocacy and support services for the child care profession. The mission of 4-C is to ensure that every child has access to high quality early care and education through integrated support and expertise. 4-C has been serving 20 Wisconsin counties or 25% of the state for 40 years. Programs implemented by 4-C include: Resource and Referral, which assists parents with their search for early care and education for their children; Certification, which assists child care providers in meeting the state requirements for certification of family day care homes; Child and Adult Care Food Program, which reimburses family day care providers for meals and snacks served to the children in their care; and Professional Development, which offers trainings and career growth to early care and education professionals at various stages of their professional development through the use of a training center, resource room, and lending library. All 4-C Programs include a Spanish-speaking component to assist with the development and improvements for child care to serve Wisconsin's growing Latino community.
